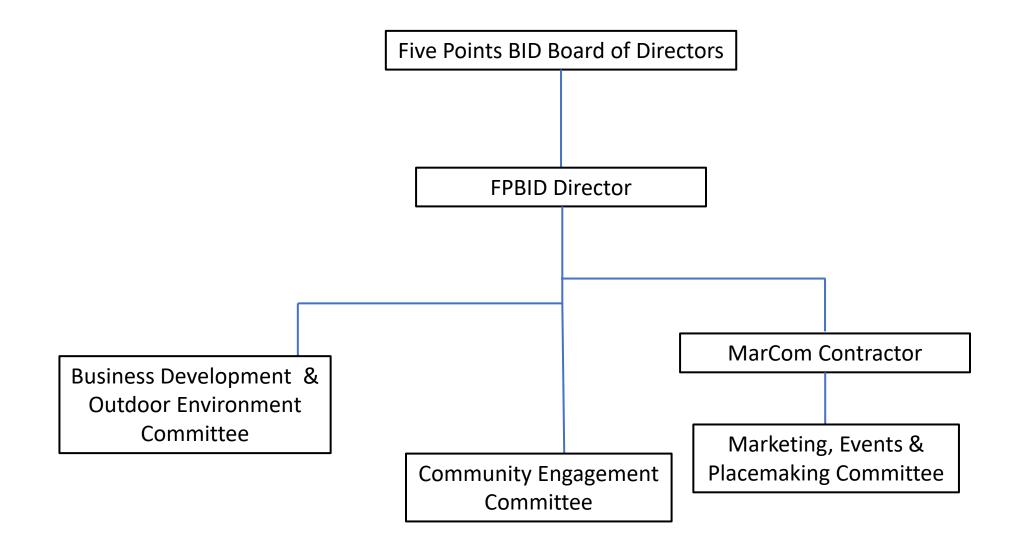

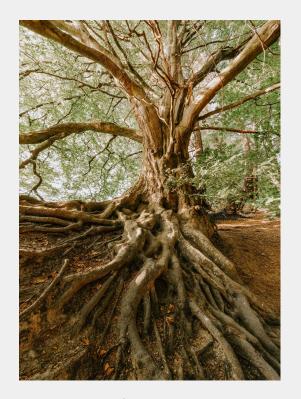

- Make quick videos of people talking about what FPBID's values mean to them and post on social media

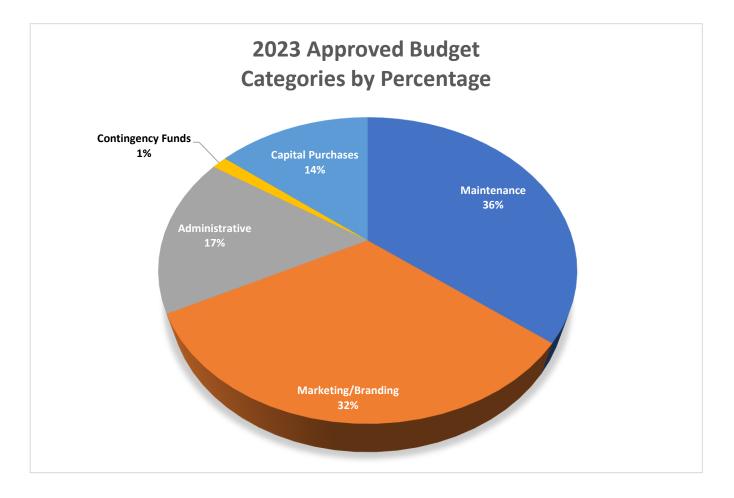
